### **INSTRUCTOR & STUDENT PRE-TEST CHECKLIST**

#### CHECKRIDE PREPARATION

When CFI's are recommending students for Practical tests, send the student's IACRA FTN# and other information to to Marc Nathanson check the 8710-1 form before the test This will save time for the DPE before the test begins.

Your students must contact the examiner at least 3 working day prior to a test to confirm the test and to receive a briefing. Several days prior is suggested which allows the applicant (your student) to plan the Cross country or to otherwise prepare for the test.

Your student must also fill out and submit a DMS form to the examiner no less than 3 working days prior to the scheduled test (preferably 5 days).

You are to endorse students for their practical test no later than 3 days prior to the test (preferably 5 days).

Instructors will NOT allow students to schedule themselves without the knowledge of the instructor endorsing their logbook and 8710-1 application / IACRA.
